AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA, PERTAINING TO TECHNICAL AMENDMENTS TO THE BROWARD COUNTY CODE OF ORDINANCES ("CODE"); AMENDING SECTIONS 1-233, 1-485, 16½-21, 26-85, AND 26-90 OF THE CODE; REPEALING ARTICLE XXXIV OF CHAPTER 1, INCLUDING SECTIONS 1-571 THROUGH 1-576 OF THE CODE; AND PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY, INCLUSION IN THE CODE, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

(Sponsored by the Board of County Commissioners)

WHEREAS, various provisions of the Broward County Code of Ordinances use outdated terminology that may not fully reflect the intent and effect of those provisions; and

WHEREAS, this Ordinance makes limited technical amendments to those provisions to update the outdated terminology and to more accurately reflect the intent and effect of those provisions,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA:

Section 1. Section 1-233 of the Broward County Code of Ordinances is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 1-233. Terms and process of appointment to Broward County agencies, authorities, boards, committees, commissions, councils, and task forces; quorum.

All appointments to advisory boards, committees, commissions, councils, and task					
forces established by Broward County ordinance or resolution (collectively, "advisory					
boards"), and all appointments to agencies, development and redevelopment authorities,					
and regulatory and adjustment boards established pursuant to federal or state law, the					
Broward County Charter, or interlocal agreements (collectively, "other boards"), except					
where inconsistent with the Broward County Charter, general or special law, or the					
enabling enactments of such advisory boards or other boards, shall be subject to the					
following requirements:					
(a) (1) An appointment for a fixed-term fixed term shall expire on the last day of the					
fixed term unless the appointee is removed for cause under federal, state,					
or local law, as applicable.

(3) Best efforts shall be employed to ensure that the membership of all advisory					
and other boards will fairly represent the diverse population and					
demographics of the County.					
Section 2. Section 1-485 of the Broward County Code of Ordinances, relating					
to the Children's Services Board, is hereby amended to read as follows:					
Sec. 1-485. Members.					
The CSB shall consist of twenty (20) members appointed by the Board.					

(b) In addition, the Board shall appoint the following additional members to the CSB:

Nine (9) members, with each member of the Board nominating one member, and the members nominated shall, to the extent possible practicable, represent the demographics diversity of the community the CSB serves, reflect the interest of the community the CSB serves, serve as the link between the CSB and the public or community, ensure that the CSB's policies and performance uphold the public interest of Broward County, and have demonstrated a proven commitment to children's welfare; and

Section 3. Article XXXIV of Chapter 1, including Sections 1-571 through 1-576, relating to the Diversity Advisory Trust Fund Account, of the Broward County Code of Ordinances, are hereby repealed in their entirety.

Section 4. Section 16½-21 of the Broward County Code of Ordinances is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 16½-21. Human rights board created; composition; terms; authorities.

(b) Each County Commissioner shall make two (2) nominations to the Board. In appointing members to the Board, the County Commission shall consider and should balance its appointments so the Board that reflects the demographics composition of Broward County in terms of race, ethnicity, national origin, age, sexual orientation, gender identity, status as a disabled individual, and religion. In addition, the County Commission

- (b) Equal employment opportunity shall be insured through an affirmative action plan.
- (c) The director of the office of equal opportunity shall be responsible for implementation of the provisions of the affirmative action plan.
- (d) Any employee who alleges discrimination in any personnel transaction shall have the right to counsel with the equal employment opportunity counselor in the employee's division with the office of equal opportunity, and, if still desired, may request a formal investigation by the office of equal opportunity with the equal employment opportunity director may file a complaint with the Professional Standards Section. Any applicant for employment who alleges discrimination in any personnel transaction shall have the right to counsel with the director of the office of equal opportunity may file a complaint with the Professional Standards Section.

Section 7. Severability.

If any portion of this Ordinance is determined by any court to be invalid, the invalid portion will be stricken, and such striking will not affect the validity of the remainder of this Ordinance. If any court determines that this Ordinance, in whole or in part, cannot be legally applied to any individual, group, entity, property, or circumstance, such determination will not affect the applicability of this Ordinance to any other individual, group, entity, property, or circumstance.

Section 8. Inclusion in the Broward County Code of Ordinances.

It is the intention of the Board of County Commissioners that the provisions of this Ordinance become part of the Broward County Code of Ordinances as of the effective date. The sections of this Ordinance may be renumbered or relettered and the word "ordinance" may be changed to "section," "article," or such other appropriate word or phrase to the extent necessary to accomplish such intention.

Section 9. Effective Date.

This Ordinance is effective as of the date provided by law.
