## ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF BROWARD
 COUNTY, FLORIDA, PERTAINING TO FLUORIDATION IN PUBLIC WATER SYSTEMS;
 REPEALING ARTICLE V OF CHAPTER 34 AND SECTIONS 34-118 THROUGH 34-122 OF
 THE BROWARD COUNTY CODE OF ORDINANCES ("CODE"); AND PROVIDING FOR
 SEVERABILITY, INCLUSION IN THE CODE, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

8 WHEREAS, certain provisions of the Broward County Code of Ordinances ("Code")
9 from 1972 require that public water systems include fluorides in accordance with the then10 current standards set forth in the Florida Administrative Code;

WHEREAS, the referenced provisions of the Florida Administrative Code were
subsequently repealed, and the Florida Legislature recently enacted Senate Bill 700, signed
by the Governor on May 15, 2025, which prohibits any additive in a public water system that
does not qualify as a "water quality additive," as defined by Florida law; and

WHEREAS, although the Code provisions at issue are no longer enforced, the Board
of County Commissioners finds it appropriate to repeal the provisions to avoid any public
confusion,

18 BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF BROWARD
19 COUNTY, FLORIDA:

Section 1. Article V of Chapter 34 and Sections 34-118 through 34-122 of the
Broward County Code of Ordinances are hereby repealed in their entirety.
