The County's Natural Resources Division/Marine Resources Section is tasked with protecting the marine resources in sovereign submerged lands adjacent to the County. These artificial reef modules were deployed as partial mitigation for environmental impacts associated with the grounding of the USS Memphis (SSN-691) in 1993. Approximately 160 'Reef Ball' modules made of concrete were deployed in 40' depth onto sand. Each module weighs approx. 1,300 lbs. and their dimensions are 0.9m high by 1.22m wide. In addition, stony corals, some now listed as threatened species, were transplanted onto the modules as part of an experimental design. The modules were deployed in 2000 and have functioned well; however, over time they have settled into the sand, with some being 30-50% covered. Loss of these modules will result in the loss of the replacement ecological function for which they were intended, in addition to the loss of many large colonies of threatened stony corals. The intent of this project is to extract the settled modules from the sand and place them in a more suitable location nearby.

The County and regional municipalities have a long-standing relationship with various military units through annual activities such as Fleet Week and the Ft. Lauderdale Air Show. Additionally, through the IRT program, Army and Navy units previously participated in 3 years (2007, 2008, 2009) of training missions in the removal of a failed tire reef. Representatives from both branches felt the missions were beneficial as the work mimicked similar dive operations conducted during actual deployments.
