A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA, AUTHORIZING APPROPRIATION AND DISBURSEMENT OF FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF CHILDREN AND FAMILIES ("DCF") FISCAL YEAR 2022-2023 GRANT FUNDS IN THE AGGREGATE AMOUNT OF \$1,810,681 TO SPECIFIED SERVICE PROVIDERS FOR THE PROVISION OF SERVICES TO SUPPORT PREVENTION, PREPARATION, AND RESPONSE TO COVID-19 AMONG INDIVIDUALS AND FAMILIES EXPERIENCING HOMELESSNESS IN BROWARD COUNTY; WAIVING THE GRANT FUNDING PROVISIONS IN CHAPTER 23, PART II, OF THE BROWARD COUNTY ADMINISTRATIVE CODE TO **ENABLE** TIMELY DISBURSEMENT OF DCF GRANT **FUNDS** AND PROVISION OF SERVICES; AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR TO EXECUTE NEW AGREEMENTS WITH THE SERVICE PROVIDERS AND TAKE ALL NECESSARY ADMINISTRATIVE AND BUDGETARY ACTIONS TO IMPLEMENT THE

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WHEREAS, the Florida Department of Children and Families ("DCF") previously awarded Emergency Solutions Grant funds ("ESG-CV Funding") to Broward County under Unified Homelessness Grant Contract JP003 for DCF fiscal years 2020-2021 and 2021-2022 to prevent, prepare for, and respond to COVID-19 among individuals and families experiencing homelessness in Broward County;

AGREEMENTS; AND PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Broward County, Florida ("Board"), has received an award from DCF of additional ESG-CV Funding for DCF fiscal year 2022-2023 ("DCF FY23"), effective from July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2023;

WHEREAS, ESG-CV Funding supports the provision of existing and additional services including emergency shelter services, rapid rehousing services, rent payment assistance, supportive services, Homeless Management Information System services, and administrative services (collectively, the "Services") to assist individuals and families experiencing homelessness in Broward County;

WHEREAS, the Board desires to appropriate and disburse ESG-CV Funding to specified service providers for the provision of Services for DCF FY23;

WHEREAS, the Human Services Department's grant funding provisions in Chapter 23, Part II, of the Broward County Administrative Code ("Administrative Code") require a formal grant process and Board adoption of a resolution authorizing the allocation of funds to service providers;

WHEREAS, waiving these provisions would allow for timely disbursement of funds and provision of necessary services to individuals and families experiencing homelessness in Broward County;

WHEREAS, the Board desires to waive the grant funding provisions in Chapter 23, Part II, of the Administrative Code to enable timely disbursement of ESG-CV Funding to specified service providers;

WHEREAS, the Board desires to authorize the Broward County Administrator ("County Administrator") to execute, on behalf of the County, new agreements with the specified service providers; and

WHEREAS, the Board finds that the Services to be funded benefit the residents of Broward County and serve a public purpose, NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA:

Section 1. Authorized Appropriation and Disbursement.

The Board hereby authorizes appropriation and disbursement of ESG-CV Funding for DCF FY23 in the aggregate amount of One Million Eight Hundred Ten Thousand Six Hundred Eighty-one Dollars (\$1,810,681) as set forth in Attachment A.

Section 2. Waiver of Chapter 23, Part II, of the Administrative Code.

The grant funding provisions in Chapter 23, Part II, of the Administrative Code are hereby waived to enable timely disbursement of ESG-CV Funding.

Section 3. Execution by the County Administrator.

The County Administrator is hereby authorized to execute, on behalf of the County, new agreements with the service providers as set forth in Attachment A in substantially the same form as the applicable Board-approved form agreement. The County Administrator is further authorized to take all necessary administrative and budgetary actions to implement the agreements as set forth in Attachment A. Nothing in this Resolution alters the requirement that agreements be reviewed for legal sufficiency by the Office of the County Attorney before execution. Any material deviations from the approved form must be presented to the Board for approval.

Section 4. Severability.

If any portion of this Resolution is determined by any court to be invalid, the invalid portion will be stricken, and such striking will not affect the validity of the remainder of this

Resolution. If any court determines that this Resolution, in whole or in part, cannot be legally applied to any individual, group, entity, property, or circumstance, such determination will not affect the applicability of this Resolution to any other individual, group, entity, property, or circumstance.

Section 5. Effective Date.

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This Resolution is effective upon adoption.
