

## State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds (SLFRF) Reporting Requirements

Contracts and Grant Agreements funded with SLFRF funds are required additional reporting requirements to be kept with the project file. Complete the required reporting questions below and return to your Contract/Grant Agreement's Contract/Grant Manager.

1. Provide a brief narrative as to how the Contractor/Grantee will comply with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964.

Broward County ("County") values diversity and welcomes input from all interested parties, regardless of cultural identity, background, or income level. Moreover, the County believes that the best programs and services result from careful consideration of the needs of all its communities. Thus, the County does not tolerate discrimination in any of its programs, services, or activities. Pursuant to Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and other federal and state authorities, the County will not exclude from participation in, deny the benefits of, or subject to discrimination anyone on the grounds of race, color, national origin, sex, age, disability, religion or family status.

Complaint Process: The County has established a discrimination complaint procedure and will take prompt and reasonable action to investigate and eliminate discrimination when found. Any person who believes that they have been subjected to discrimination based upon race, color, national origin, sex, religion, age, disability or family status in any County program, service or activity may file a complaint with the Title VI Coordinator:

If possible, the complaint should be submitted in writing and contain the identity of the complainant; the basis for the allegations (i.e., race, color, national origin, sex, religion, age, disability or family status); and a description of the alleged discrimination with the date of occurrence. If the complaint cannot be submitted in writing, the complainant should contact the Title VI Coordinator for assistance. The Title VI Coordinator will respond to the complaint within thirty (30) calendar days and will take reasonable steps to resolve the matter. Should the County be unable to satisfactorily resolve a complaint, the County will forward the complaint, along with a record of its disposition to the appropriate federal agency.
